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## INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS (IMTS) SEPTEMBER 2018

### Highlights

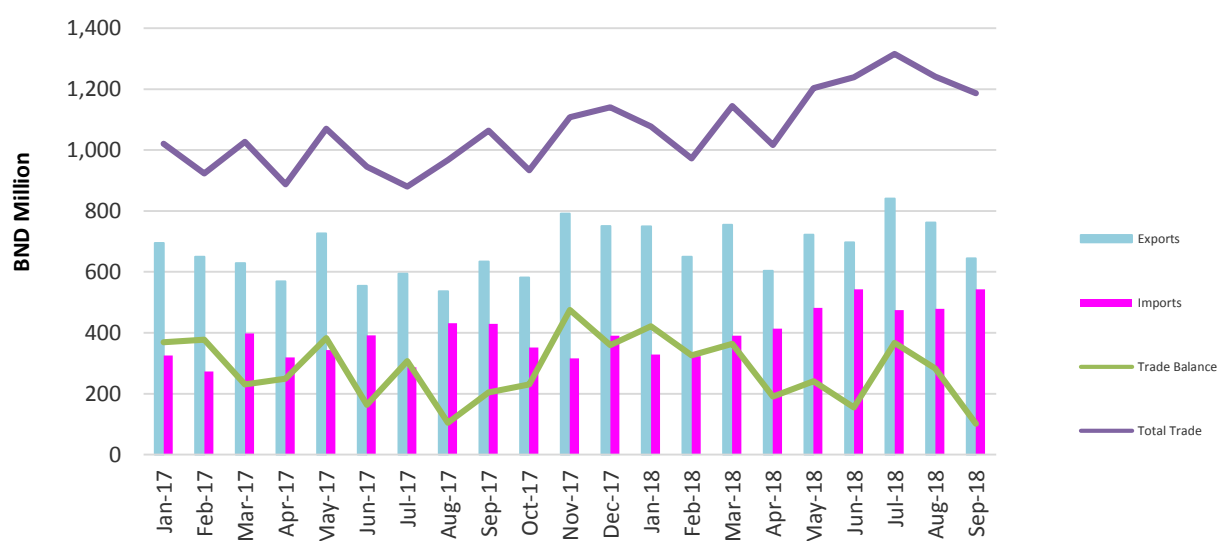
- Total trade for the month of September 2018 was BND1,187.1 million, comprising of exports amounting to BND644.1 million and imports valued at BND543.0 million.
- This represented an increase of 11.6 per cent year-on-year (y-o-y) from BND1,063.8 million in September 2017. Meanwhile, the trade balance recorded a decrease from BND204.4 million in September 2017 to BND101.1 million (September 2018).
- On a month-on-month (m-o-m) basis, total trade decreased by 4.4 per cent compared to August 2018 due to a decrease in exports by 15.5 per cent.
- On a year-to-date (YTD) basis (Jan-Sep 2018), total trade increased by 18.4 per cent and trade balance increased by 2.5 per cent.

## Merchandise Exports

### Exports by Commodity Section

On a y-o-y basis, the merchandise exports grew by 1.6 per cent from BND634.1 million in September 2017 to BND644.1 million in September 2018. Mineral Fuels recorded the highest contribution of total exports with BND567.5 million followed by Machinery and Transport Equipment (BND38.7 million), and Chemicals (BND24.1 million).

Meanwhile, on a m-o-m basis the merchandise exports decreased by 15.5 per cent from BND762.2 million in August 2018 to BND644.1 million in September 2018.

### Major Exports

On a y-o-y basis, major exports decreased by 5.7 per cent in September 2018. This was mainly due to a decrease in the exports of Liquefied Natural Gas by 29.8 per cent. However, exports of Crude Oil increased by 28.8 per cent.

The decrease in the exports of Liquefied Natural Gas was due to a decrease in the trade volume of LNG from 1,046,366 MMBtu per day (September 2017) to 569,925 MMBtu per day (September 2018)

Meanwhile, the increase in the exports of Crude Oil was attributed by an increase in the export price of Crude Oil from USD56.81/bbl (September 2017) to USD80.08/bbl (September 2018).

On a m-o-m basis, major exports decreased by 19.2 per cent in September 2018. This was due to a decrease in the exports of Liquefied Natural Gas by 35.3 per cent.

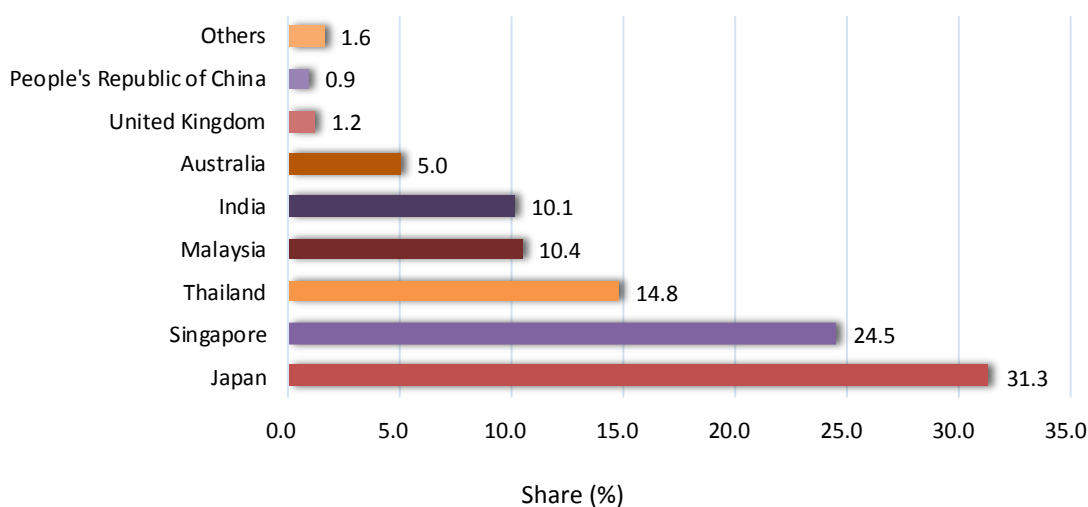

### Destinations of Exports

By country of destination, the highest share of exports in September 2018 went to Japan (31.3 per cent). This was followed by Singapore (24.5 per cent), Thailand (14.8 per cent), and Malaysia (10.4 per cent).

## Merchandise Imports

### Imports by Commodity Section

In September 2018, merchandise imports increased by 26.4 per cent (y-o-y) from BND429.7 million in September 2017 to BND543.0 million (September 2018). Machinery and Transport Equipment recorded the highest contribution of imports with BND234.0 million followed by Manufactured Goods (BND151.3 million) and Mineral Fuels (BND45.2 million).

On a m-o-m basis, total imports increased by 13.3 per cent, among others attributed to higher imports were Manufactured Goods, Mineral Fuels and Crude Materials Inedible.

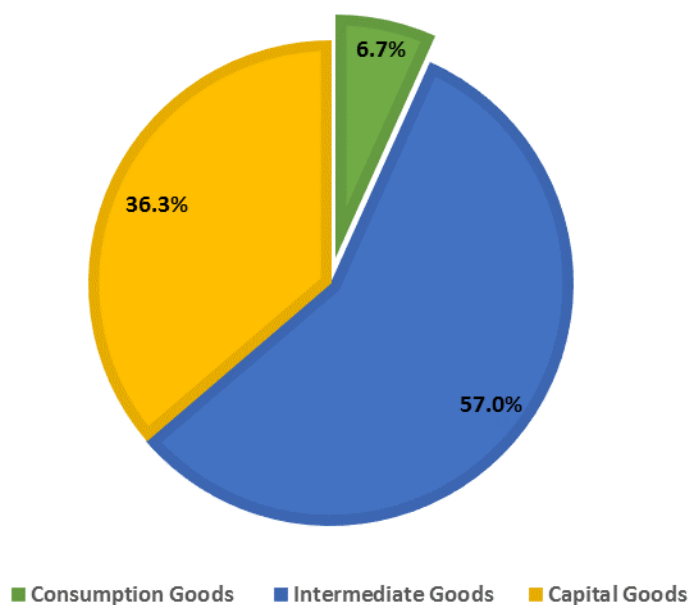

### Imports by End-Use Category

In September 2018, imports of Intermediate Goods accounted for 57.0 per cent of the total imports. This was followed by Capital Goods and Consumption Goods, with 36.3 per cent and 6.7 per cent respectively.

**Chart 3: Contribution of Import by End Use Category Classification, September 2018**

The main imports of Capital Goods were Machinery and Transport Equipment, Manufactured Goods, and Chemicals. Of these, the largest share was Machinery and Transport Equipment valued at BND105.3 million.

Meanwhile, the highest share of Intermediate Goods imports was Machinery and Transport Equipment (BND119.4 million). This was followed by imports of Manufactured Goods (BND77.5 million) and Mineral Fuels (BND42.0 million).

On the other hand, Consumption Goods imports were household items such as Food (BND10.6 million), Machinery and Transport Equipment (BND9.4 million) and Manufactured Goods (BND7.0 million).

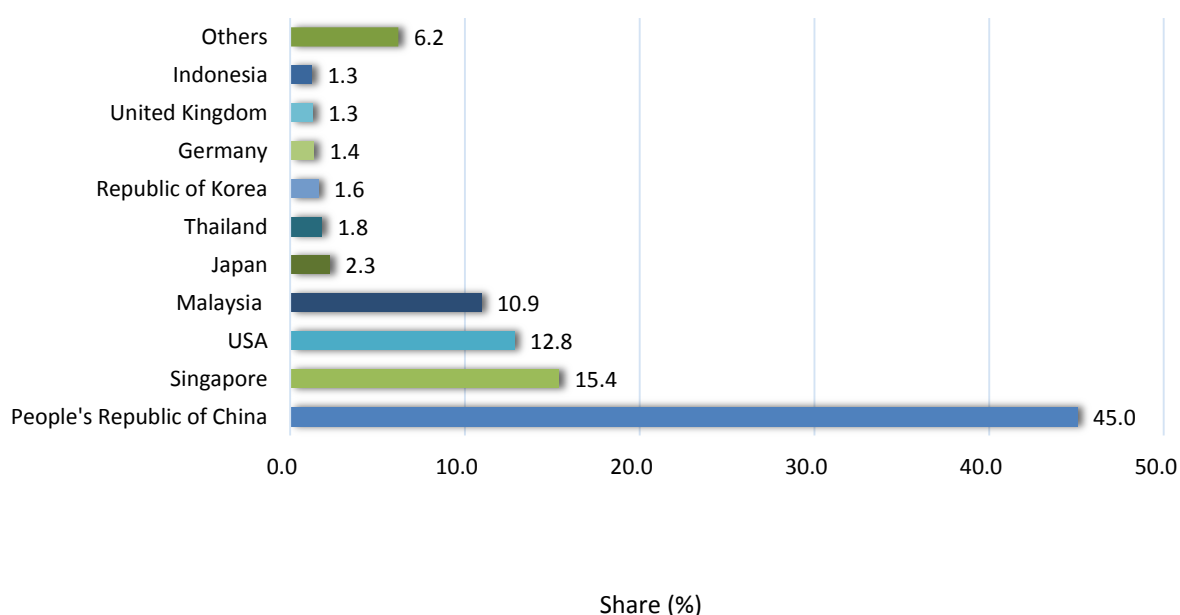

### Origin of Imports

The highest share of imports in September 2018 came from People's Republic of China accounting for 45.0 per cent, followed by Singapore (15.4 per cent), USA (12.8 per cent) and Malaysia (10.9 per cent).

## Merchandise trade by mode of transport

### Main mode of transport

The main mode of transport for Brunei Darussalam's international merchandise trading is sea transport, followed by air transport, land transport and other modes of transport.

In September 2018, the total value of goods transported by sea for both exports and imports was BND1,048.5 million. The relative share of sea transport accounted for 94.5 per cent of goods exported from and 81.0 per cent of goods imported into Brunei Darussalam. Goods transported by air contributed about 5.2 per cent of goods exports and 15.3 per cent of goods imports, meanwhile cross border trading via land recorded 0.3 per cent of exported goods and 3.7 per cent of imported goods.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

### 1. Introduction

The International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) are compiled on a monthly basis based on the import and export data submitted by the Royal Customs and Excise Department, Ministry of Finance and Economy through customs declarations and Ministry of Energy (Energy and Manpower) and Industry. The general system of recording IMTS adopted by Brunei Darussalam covers imports, domestic exports and re-exports that have been cleared through customs.

### 2. Coverage of Merchandise

All goods imported into or exported from Brunei Darussalam are included in the IMTS.

The following classes of goods are excluded:

- currency notes and coins in circulation;
- personal and household effects which do not incur any Brunei Darussalam customs duty and which are taken by passengers for their own use;
- stores and fuel supplied to Brunei ships and aircraft;
- articles on loan or rent, for example, equipment for oil surveys and experimental drilling, etc.;
- goods in transit;
- fish and other marine products landed from Brunei Darussalam fishing vessels direct from fishing grounds;
- goods imported and exported by or on behalf of diplomatic services; and
- goods imported by the armed forces.

### 3. Time of Recording

Brunei Darussalam uses the 'release date' as its time of recording, which provides the time/date that stipulated in source documents when goods enter or leave the economic territory.

### 4. Valuation

Imports are valued at CIF, that is, the value of goods at the frontier of the exporting country plus the cost of insurance and freight and any other charges when sold for export to Brunei Darussalam. Custom duties are not included in the value of imports.

Exports are valued at FOB, that is, the value of goods to be purchased abroad up to the point where the goods are deposited on board the outgoing vessel, aircraft and/or vehicle. Goods on consignment are valued at the current import price for imports and the current export price for exports.

Goods are recorded at their market value. Values are reported in millions of Brunei dollars. Data reported in foreign currencies are converted into local currency at the prevailing market exchange rate on the date of permit clearance.

## 5. Commodity Classification

Commodity items reported are classified in accordance with the Brunei Darussalam Trade Classification and Customs Duties 2017. This classification incorporates the ASEAN Harmonized Tariff Nomenclature (AHTN), which is based on the 6-digits Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (H.S) developed by the World Customs Organisation (WCO).

For International comparability in this report, import and export are classified according to the United Nations Standard Trade Classification, Revision 4 (SITC Rev. 4) for the purpose of international comparability of statistics on external trade.

The imports data can also be categorized according to their end-use categories, namely Capital, Intermediate or Consumption based on Brunei Darussalam's Broad Economic Categories (BDBEC), which is adapted from United Nation, the Fifth revision of Broad Economic Categories.

The BDBEC is classified in accordance with Broad Economic Category introduced by the United Nations and as a means for converting data compiled in terms of SITC into end-use categories.

The BDBEC provides categories which can be aligned into 3 large classes of goods in the System of National Accounts (SNA):

- Capital Goods are used as a means of producing other goods or services.
- Intermediate Goods are semi-processed, semi-manufactured and industrial-supplies; and transformed or used up in the production of goods and services.
- Consumption Goods are final product mainly used by households for final consumption.

## 6. Mode of transport

Merchandise trade in goods by mode of transport are compiled according to the means of transport used when goods enter or leave the economic territory of a country. The following classifications are the main categories of the mode of transport:

1. Air;
2. Sea;
3. Land; and
4. Others include postal consignments, mail or courier shipments and goods crossing the border not to attribute a transaction to any specific mode of transport categories.

The method of transport used for the carriage of goods is recorded as the mode of transport such as aircraft, vehicle, vessel and other type of transport of goods. The mode of transport for imports refers to the last mode of transport by which the cargo was transported to the port of clearance into the country whereas, for exports the mode of transport information records the last mode of transport with which cargo crossed the customs border on its exit from the country.
